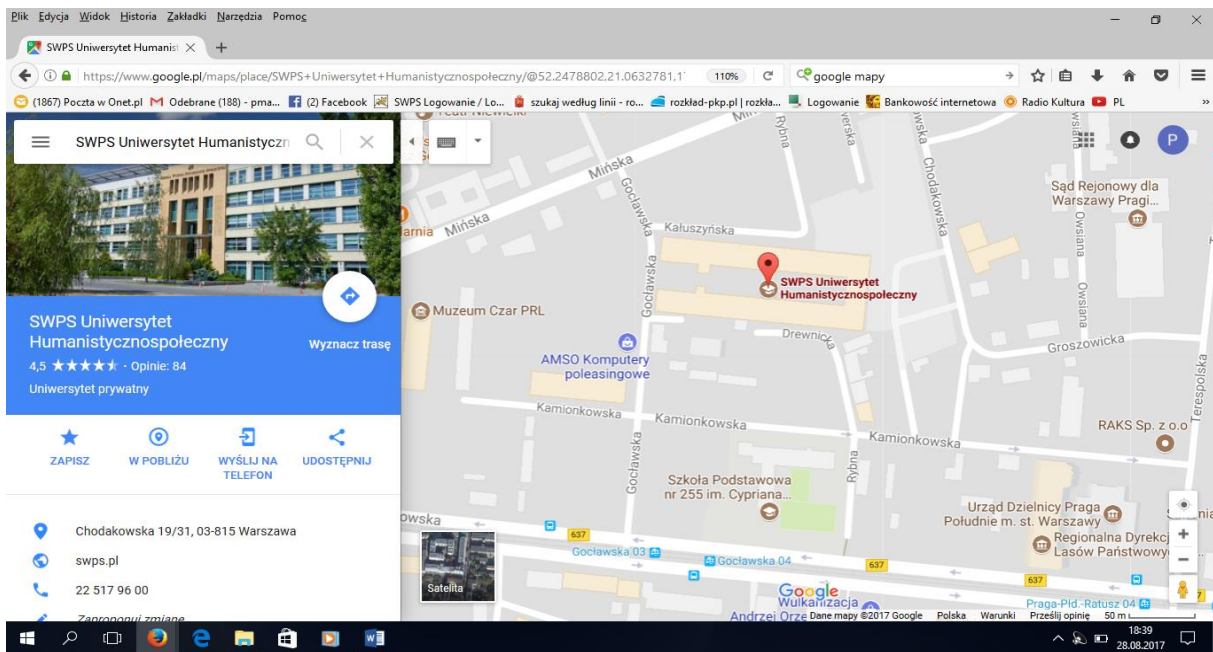

### How to get to the University SWPS:

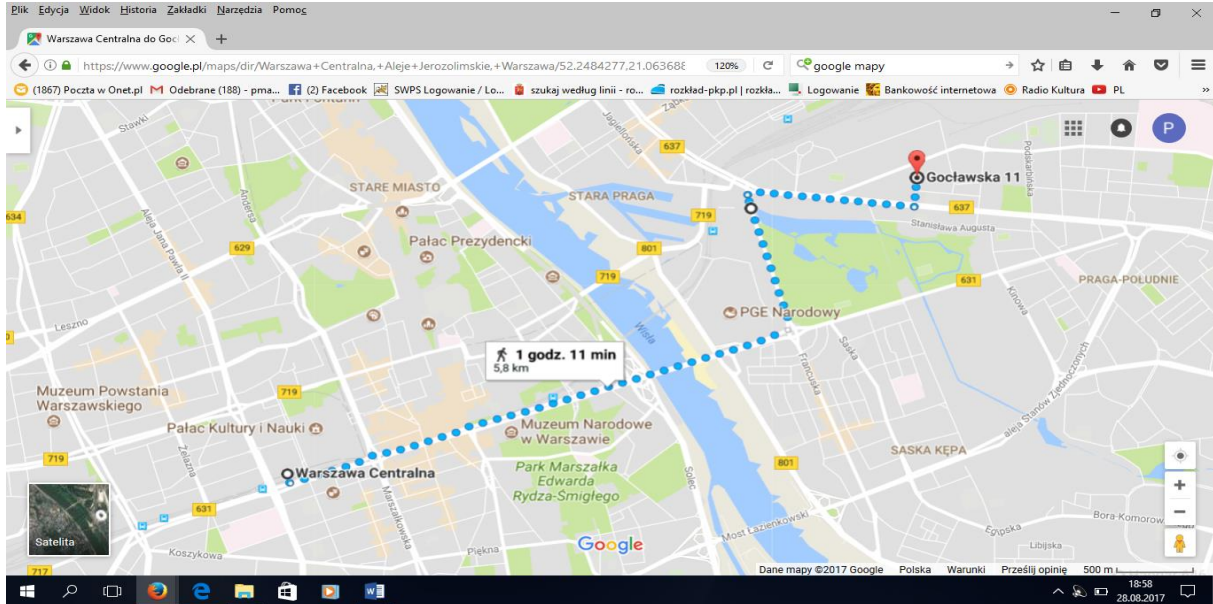

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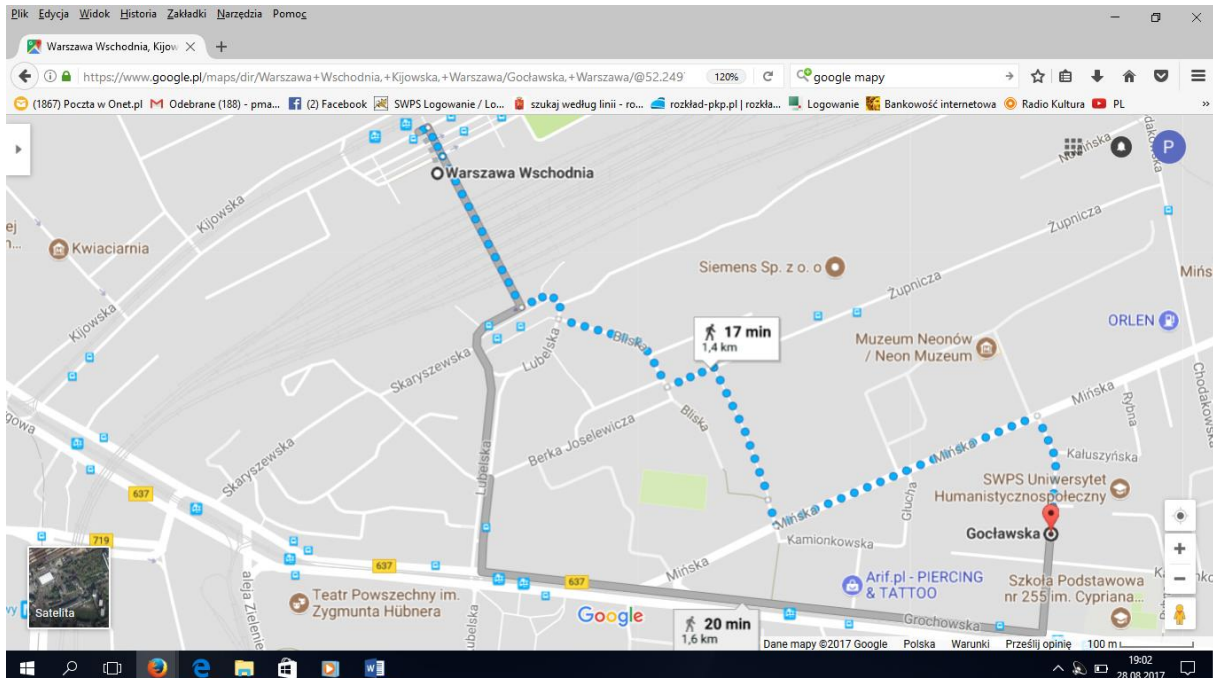


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- **From Warsaw East Railway Station** – you can take a walk – approximately it will take around 20 minutes:
